

Welcome to the Mukinbudin Botanical Walk Recreational Trail Guide. We hope you enjoy this 4.6 kilometre walk around the Mukinbudin Townsite. At the preferred start of the trail which is located at No: 20 there is a rare and endangered walk showcasing local flora which then extends out into the recreational trail. There is also signage which has information on flora native to this area at this point.

To find your way around the trail we have provided you with a map that outlines the key locations on the trip. You will also find as you are walking our trail markers at strategic points. The markers are a small round sign with a figure walking.

Around the trail various equipment has been installed. Four lifestyle stations have been installed at intervals for your use. These have panels which clearly identify how to safely use this equipment. Seating and two water fountains have also been installed for your comfort.

The Mukinbudin Community hope you enjoy using this trail and we ask that you abide by the few safety tips included to make your trip as enjoyable as possible.

Safety on the Trail:

During the summer, Mukinbudin can reach temperatures above 40 degrees. We recommend you utilise the water fountains and if needed take a water bottle with you. Please take the necessary precautions to avoid sun damage which include wearing sunscreen, a hat and protective clothing. It is recommended to wear covered shoes and to watch for snakes. Feel free to have a rest on the seating provided around the trail.

Some Rules:

We ask that you please abide by the following rules of the Recreational trail. The rules are in place to make the trail safe and enjoyable for everyone.

Dogs

You are more than welcome to walk your pets on the trail providing they are on a leash. It is also asked that owners remove any of their pets excrement. At both water fountains dog bowls are provided for your pets to drink from.

No Vehicles



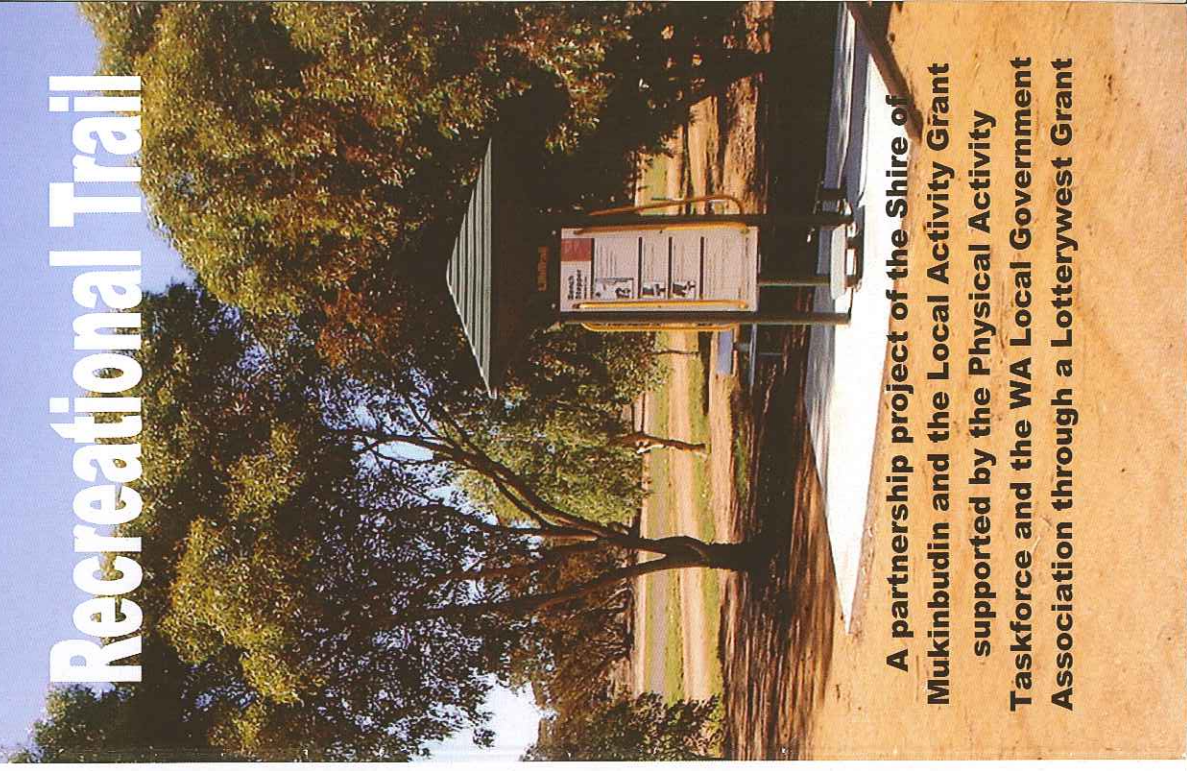
No Motorbikes

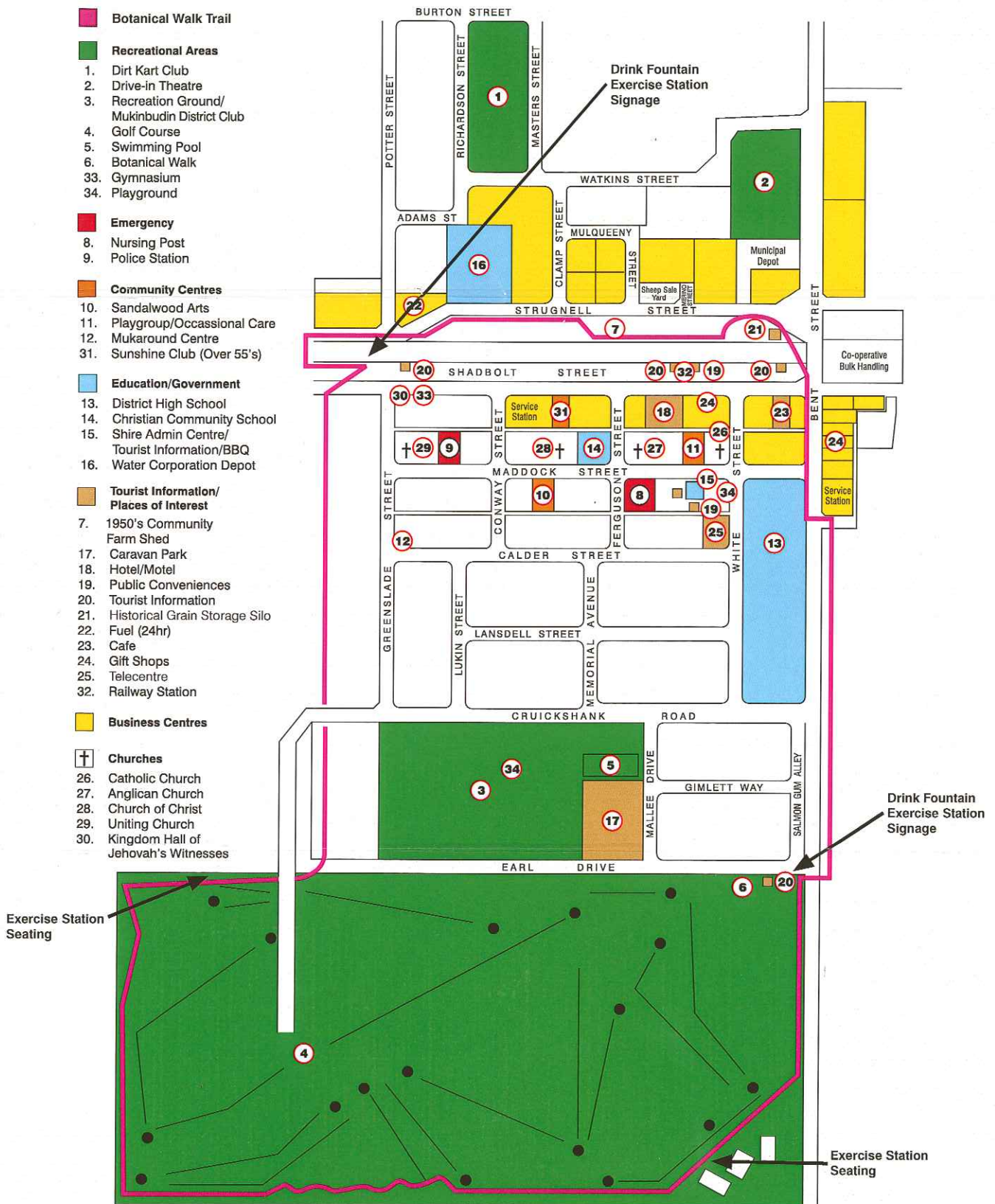
